## Citizen science plastic drive coming to Cott

Research into microplastics washing ashore is coming to Cottesloe beach, thanks to an Australian-first citizen science initiative, Australian Microplastic Assessment Project (AUSMAP).

Plastic pollution is recognised as one of the world's most pressing environmental issues, with growing concern over the effects of microplastics, those smaller than 5mm, on the environment and on human health.

AUSMAP is Australia's first citizen science initiative, which educates and engages communities to obtain widespread reliable data on the presence of microplastics.

Now recognised as one of the world's leading citizen-science microplastic projects, AUSMAP has progressed rapidly over just two years.

The program encourages Australians to take leadership on solving the plastic pollution problem while arming them with the tools to educate others.

AUSMAP developed the project in partnership with research scientists to ensure the data collected is reliable enough to produce one uniform framework to measure microplastic presence across Australia and beyond.

Dr Michelle Blewitt, project director at AUSMAP, said: "Our program has trained and continues to work alongside more than 325 groups nationally.

"Across Australia, we have collected well over 350 samples, engaged more than 200 university students, educated over 475 corporate members, close to 2000

community members, more than 8000 high school students.

"Most importantly, we've removed over 100,000 microplastics from entering our waterways.

We are thankful for the support from the Coca-Cola Foundation, which has allowed us to create this one-of-a-kind program and to now continue progressing the important work we are undertaking in our next phase."

In 2020, the Coca-Cola Foundation awarded more than \$1million in funding to environmental initiatives, with a significant focus on recycling, upcycling and marine litter

programs, including AUSMAP. AUSMAP's citizen-science findings have been presented at 13 national and international conferences or workshops

The project has received increasing international in-terest with discussions under way for a global microplastics project collaboration based in the UK, as well as discussions with Earth Echo International and Earthwatch International.
